The "twin transformation" refers to the current trends of digitalization and sustainability, whose interplay is complex, dynamic, and potentially ambivalent. While digitalization can support sustainability goals by enabling efficiency gains and smarter resource use, it also relies on high resource consumption and may trigger rebound effects. Individuals, organizations, and societies are both targets and drivers of the twin transformation. Investigating it requires understanding its harmonies, contradictions, and how it connects to individual, organizational, and societal demands and activities.
