

Objective

BESST is a research retreat of the Faculty of Business, Economics and Social Sciences. The aim is to improve connections between researchers and research topics at the faculty. It is about strengthening exchange and collaboration in research and thus increasing quality and impact.

Target group

All researchers of the faculty are cordially invited to listen and participate in the discussion.

Short presentations can be given by professors, academic councilors, lecturers, habilitation candidates, postdocs - also as a joint presentation with a doctoral candidate.

Topics

Ideally, the contributions should relate to projects or ideas that are in preparation or that you would like to develop further in the future. The aim is not to present published work, but to discuss possible future (joint) projects. We invite you to submit contributions related to the three Focus Areas of our Faculty:

- Digital Transformation and Change
- Sustainable Economy and Consumption
- Inequality and Diversity

We also welcome contributions that cannot be specifically assigned to these Focus Areas, for example on topics such as computational science, data science, finance, health, public administration or other topics. Anything that the faculty members are researching is interesting!

Formats

Please note that the language of the retreat is English. All contributions are to be submitted and presented accordingly.

Short presentations followed by a discussion are very welcome (e.g. 15 min. presentation + 15 min. discussion; please let us know if you have other requests). This can be a free presentation, with the support of slides or flipcharts, a software demonstration, pantomime, etc.

Panel discussions are very welcome (e.g. 45 minutes). 3-5 researchers on the podium. Moderated discussion among the panel and with the audience.

Guest speakers with a connection to our thematic focuses could be a good fit.
